Incident reports are confidential, secure. New electronic incident reporting system (ORIGAMI) live end of March. Allows tracking, analysis, and communication USC WorkWell Center – Revised Mission – Enrich mind and spirit, honor whole person, make USC destination of choice (best of the best). Provides Health & Well-being, Counseling, Coaching, Consulting, Talks & Groups. Hub/Team that supports all domains of well-being [Q: Common student incident report is needle sticks. Will that system change? A: No, continue to report through Student Health.] 	
Faculty Spotlight David Dadiomov	 Clinical Pharmacy Dept. PGY2 Clin Psych Pharm Program Director. Talking today about Corrections program and new Addiction Medicine program at LAC+USC. Collaborative practice arrangement. 	

	 Outpatient/Urgent Care practice, plus inpatient consult service. Also jail ward and corrections facility discharge support/bridge clinic. Includes long-acting/injectable substance use meds; depo-antipsychotics planned. Incorporates PharmD and post-grad student experiences Inpatient Consult Services include: OD, Complex Pain, Trauma, Jail Ward Also: Contingency Management (gift card for staying off methamphetamine), and harm reduction (safer consumption/supply distribution) Planning new Opioid Stewardship Program Agile team of MDs, PharmDs, NP, students, and counselors. Conducting a policy analysis on buprenorphine distribution practices; have had some other recent publications. [Comment: Great Program! Team does a great job also at teaching.] [Q: How does inpatient consultation work? Individual, or as group? A: Mainly, for formal addiction medicine consults, work as team, depending on need.] 	
Chat GPT and AI Language Models K Franson	 What is it? Are we doomed? [Video Presentation.] Trained on the web data sources, but NO real-time connection. Only gives answers based on prior training set. Many uses, many limitations. So, not up to date, not always correct. Previously, could also not do references, but now with Microsoft Bing linkage, will be able to. M Wu tried using it to do a CNS course homework assignment – did pretty well, got some things wrong. Do we need a specific policy on using/misusing AI – ethical concerns, (e.g. plagiarism, etc.)? Other Universities are starting to publish policies. [Discussion/Comments: Need a policy. Want to prevent, detect abuse. How do we develop a policy? Must disclose use (including what for). Must verify any AI derived information. Students should be able to perform all work WITHOUT this tool. Need to recognize that it will be used; should demonstrate to students how it is helpful, where it goes wrong – i.e., provide context to clinical practice – lives are on the line.] Scholarship Standards Committee can draft a policy and submit it for PFC approval. [I Steinberg: If we create a policy, will also need governance/enforcement. Who, how?]
