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| Research Office Update Annie Wong-Beringer | Resources: Pre-Submission Resources, Grant and Manuscript Editing, Intramural Awards, Undergrad and PharmD summer internships, \$4.5M invested in equipment/tech support/data core | |
| | Editing Svcs are \$1,000-\$1,500 per faculty per year Intramural Grants – Expanded to 3 tracks: Toolset Expansion, Intramural Efforts, Al | |
| | Projects • Expanded Core Facilities: TRLab (Translation Research), MassSpec Core; Medicinal Chemistry Core; TEM Center (Electron Microscopy; in partnership with Keck) • Core Facilities operate at 50% cost recovery; deficit supported from SoP budget • Direct and questions to the Core Facilities Advisory Committee Reps • New HSC Research Building also in process – 80 PIs (all schools) 75% wet, 25% dry | |

| Ally Blackboard Tool Ingrid Steiner, Stacey Hearn, Jason Dove | New Tool at USC – Universal design for learning assists in making course materials more accessible to learners (disability accommodations, other access issues) Driven by social justice model – adapt environment to people, not force people to adapt to environment Addresses Usability and Access – Examples: Cognitive, Visual, Auditory, Motor, Speech challenges (at USC 10-15% of students <i>disclose</i> these each year) Benefits often accrue more broadly – 'curb cut effect' (not just mobility challenged, also bikes, strollers, skateboards, etc.) Tool Details: Three Pieces: Indicates materials' level of accessibility (gauges), automatically suggests alternative course material formats (some fixes require manual action); gives overall accessibility report. Only the faculty can see full reports; staff only sees aggregate reports | |
| | [Q: I got a red gauge on my syllabus. How to fix a syllabus? A: 1) We (e.g., SOP) can update the syllabi format systematically. 2) There are expert resources to fix specific issues. | |
| AACP Survey Results Maryann Wu | No national peer comparison results yet. USC results available. Annual (graduating students/faculty), q3 years (alumni/preceptors) Students: Demographics mostly stable; fewer going to chain pharmacy, more to independent; fewer to hospitals; more to industry. | |
| | Employment: Mostly California, some NW, NE, Texas Many (>40%) do residency, fellowship (9%), other degree Faculty& Student Replies: Lots of Data – Online (Tableau), Available for Self-Study use, Organized by Standard Many areas were improving: e.g., Staff, Faculty, Facilities | |
