Dean's Report V Papadopoulos	<ul> <li>Town Hall upcoming</li> <li>Year has started, teaching as well. Numbers fine for PharmD - 180 [P1], increase for some MS and the undergrad program</li> <li>Design of our floor at Law School building progressing (for weekend and undergrad programs). May be done in 2 years.</li> <li>Likewise design of HSC research building progressing. Planning for a building opening event in progress.</li> <li>All Five School Health Sciences Schools collaboration is ongoing. New for some schools, familiar for us and Medical School. Tightly associated with \$3 Billion capital campaign. Every gift counts, but focus on big gifts; one flagship program is precision health.</li> <li>President Folt is happy with SoP activities, ex: Vaccination programs (COVID, Monkeypox, influenza)</li> <li>Pending meeting with University to discuss forced set-aside from next budget to protect against anticipated crisis/downturn next year.</li> <li>[Q: Possibilities of interactions with Social Work School? A: Yes, especially on mental health. Also other clinical services delivery, and advocacy on reproductive rights.]</li> </ul>	
International Programs     Rory Kim, Ian Haworth,     Terrence Graham	<ul> <li>Goals: Inject global perspective, develop strategic partnerships, increase student participation, attract future leaders, support international students, introduce innovative collaborative models.</li> <li>Accomplishments: Integrated between departments and disciplines for teaching, collaboration, student learning; raised SoP profile for recruitment, research; expanded scholarship opportunities, other collaborations; engaged alumni</li> <li>Pandemic drove further integration of disparate programs with move to online; this summer back in person/hybrid, with integrated format. Our students can serve as paid course assistants – for experience as teachers and leaders, plus international exposure.</li> <li>Many presentations and posters resulted from the student projects. Also, peer-reviewed publications about the program.</li> <li>Thinking about adding fully online program(s).</li> <li>[Q: How was participant feedback? A: Very positive overall. Online component students more focused, better student feedback. In person, students less focused (Tired? Distracted?).</li> </ul>	
Accreditation update Siu-Fun Wong	<ul> <li>Gradually moving toward task completion. Met with majority of SSTs last two months. Now in final updates.</li> <li>Due date for final drafts moved to Sep 22<sup>nd</sup>. Final report will then be sent out 3 days prior to Oct 4 mini retreat</li> <li>Remember to include all 2022 AACP survey data!</li> </ul>	

The 2022 AACP     Graduating Student and     Faculty Survey results     Maryann Wu	<ul> <li>Final, final drafts from SSTs due by November 16<sup>th</sup>. Dean will review, faculty then approve by January 10<sup>th</sup>.</li> <li>[Q: Okay to leave tracked changes in? A: Yes. I will clean them up, but want to see the history.]</li> <li>Peer and National Survey results now available, not just already discussed USC-only results</li> <li>National – Every participating school (students – 140 schools; faculty – 104 schools)</li> <li>Peer (Student) Schools (Looked at rankings, MS students, PhD students, faculty size, class size, geography etc.) =&gt; Ten Schools, UCSF, UCSD, U Minn, U Illinois Chicago, etc.</li> <li>Did much better than peers (&gt; +5%) in several areas on student survey, especially for Standards 12, 13, 14 &amp; 15</li> <li>Likewise did much better than peers on Faculty survey. (Dean was +27.0%)</li> <li>[Q: Problem areas vs peer schools? A: No – Some areas where we are below our goal, but other peer schools have similar problems.]</li> <li>[Q: Why fewer faculty surveys? A: Not all schools do it yearly]</li> </ul>	
Chair/Associate Dean Reports	<ul> <li>A Wong-Beringer – Presentation on Core Research facilities and research support services will be on Sep 22, 11am-2pm.</li> <li>E Pacifici – Some faculty and staff medical issues, but semester is off to a good start. Symposium next Friday (Sep 23) on emerging technology – medical devices.
